# **COVID Reminders**

- 1. Be absent: We all try to avoid absences, but there are times when it is important. If you are not feeling well with any cold or flu-like symptoms, it is best to stay home.
- 2. Hand hygiene is critical: Even before COVID-19, studies had shown that regular hand hygiene in schools can decrease absenteeism due to illness by about 40%! Staff and children should wash their hands often, or use hand sanitizer if hand washing is not immediately available.
- Space Out: In order to protect students from transmitting illnesses, spacing out refers to physical spacing. A person can become infected by spending time within 6 feet of an infected person.
- 4. Wear a mask if you can tolerate one: We encourage all students and staff to wear masks in common areas of the school, or when physical distancing is not possible.
